Title: A CONCURRING RESOLUTION CONCERNING DISINVESTMENT OF
THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA ENDOWMENT AND FOUNDATION

Whereas: Sudan is home to one of the world's largest humanitarian
crises today; and a genocide is currently being carried
out against the people in the Darfur region; and,

Whereas: American companies are forbidden to work with the
government of the Sudan; and,

Whereas: Many universities including Harvard, Stanford, Brown, and Georgetown have
also pledged not to invest in companies dealing with the governments of Sudan;
and,

Whereas: The University of Oklahoma Foundation and the Endowment have stated that
they have no current investments in the companies listed below on December 10,
2005; and,

Whereas: Many of the firms listed below play a crucial role in the
Sudan's oil industry, which generate revenues that -by the
government's own admission- allow the Khartoum regime to
increase the lethality and intensity of its war against
its own citizens.

Let it therefore be resolved:

Section 1: The UOSA Student Congress requests a prohibition on
investment by the University of Oklahoma Foundation and Endowment in
companies doing business with the government of the Sudan, which according to
the International Monetary Fund include, but are not limited to: Sinopec,
PetroChina, ABB, Alcatel, ONGC, and Petronas. We request that the University
not invest in these companies so long as they are recognized as doing business
with the government of Sudan and until such time that the genocide has ended.
